University of Wrocław has a rich history of more than three centuries. Founded by Leopold I Habsburg, the University evolved from a modest school run by Jesuits into one of the biggest academic institutions in Poland At present, in this large public university with 3341 employees (1856 academic staff, 1485 administrative staff) more than 27 000 students are pursuing more than 70 areas of study offered by 10 Faculties at all levels, from bachelor's degree to PhD.
